Subject: Scope of Practice/Procedure – ALS Local Optional Scope

Oxytocin

Associated Policies:

- I. Therapeutic Effects
 - A. Causes uterine contraction.
 - B. Causes lactation.
 - C. Slows postpartum vaginal bleeding.
- II. Indications
 - A. Abnormal postpartum vaginal bleeding.
- III. Contraindications
 - A. Absolute:
 - 1. Any condition other than postpartum bleeding.
 - 2. Cesarean section.
 - B. Relative:
 - 1. None.
- IV. Dosage
 - A. IM:
 - 1. 10 units following delivery of placenta.
 - B. IV drip:
 - 1. 10 units in 1000 ml of IV solution.
 - 2. Titrate drip rate according to the severity of bleeding and the uterine response (i.e. may be run wide open if indicated by hemorrhagic shock).
 - a. Reassess uterine tone and provide uterine massage in addition to oxytocin to maintain a firm fundus. Reduce drip rate slowly to maintain a firm fundus.
 - b. Repeat dosing requires Verbal Base Contact.
- V. Adverse Effects
 - A. Anaphylaxis.
 - B. Cardiac arrhythmias.
- VI. Special Instructions
 - A. Verify delivery of the baby and the placenta and that there is not another baby before administering Oxytocin.
 - B. Aggressive use of Oxytocin can cause uterine rupture. Be alert to increased pain or bleeding.
 - C. Hypertension.
