HUMBOLDT COUNTY – EXCLUSIVE OPERATING AUTHORITY (EOA) QUARTERLY SUMMARY REPORT – CY 2025

- History Non-competitive EOA contracts with Arcata-Mad River Ambulance (AMRA) specific to the Arcata Zone (1) and City Ambulance of Eureka (CAE) specific to the Eureka Zone (3) with ongoing coverage of southern Humboldt County (Zone 4), were executed effective January 1, 2022. Both providers are now in the monitoring stage and reporting quarterly. The following is provided as an overview of this process.

III. Summary of issues -

Ongoing verification efforts to ensure reporting of EOA response times for CAE and AMRA are consistent with NCEMS database. — Due to data transmission interruptions between NCEMS and ICEMA (ImageTrend) beginning with NEMSIS 3.5 upgrade during CY 2023, NCEMS continues running reports from both NCEMS and GMR to verify gaps are being resolved by cross walking data for continuity. Updated team meetings quarterly with NCEMS and GMR have resulted in some adjustments prompting discrepancy rate improvements. Q2 2025, ~ 1% rate down from ~10%. Will continue to monitor at least one more quarter to ensure improvements.

<u>Code 3 calls –</u> (dispatch time to arrive on scene data obtained from ePCR system) - Calculated by EOA Officer to ensure no degradation in historical response times established per contract. Lists continue to be submitted to Directors at both AMRA and CAE for secondary review including acceptable exemptions (i.e. system overload, > 5 miles from city center, wrong address, unavoidable delays).
