I.	Term:

	and sh	This agreement shall begin on, and terminate on, and shall be automatically renewed on an annual basis unless terminated by either party giving sixty (60) days written notice to the other party.					
	compl provid	<b>NCEMS</b> may suspend or revoke this Agreement and base hospital approval for failure to comply with any applicable policies, procedures, or regulations. <b>NCEMS</b> agrees to provide written notice of any claim that <b>HOSPITAL</b> has so failed to comply, and thirty (30) days in which <b>HOSPITAL</b> may respond prior to any such suspension or revocation.					

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#### II. HOSPITAL Agrees:

- A. To meet the requirements for program participation and base hospital designation as specified in state law and by **NCEMS**.
- B. To supervise the pre-hospital treatment, triage, and transport of assigned service provider personnel according to the policies, procedures, and protocols of **NCEMS**.
- C. To the utilization of facilities, equipment, and staff in teaching, supervision, continuing education, and evaluation of assigned pre-hospital personnel.
- D. To designate a Prehospital Care Medical Director (PCMD) who shall be a physician on the hospital staff, licensed in the State of California and have experience in emergency medical care. This physician shall be regularly assigned to the emergency department, have experience in and knowledge of base hospital telecommunications and NCEMS policies and procedures. The PCMD shall be responsible for overall medical control and supervision of the EMT-II/P program within the base hospital's area of responsibility, including review of patient records and critique with prehospital and hospital personnel involved. The PCMD shall be responsible for reporting deficiencies in prehospital patient care to NCEMS, and shall perform additional functions as specified by NCEMS policy.
- E. To appoint a Prehospital Care Nurse Coordinator (PCNC) who is an Authorized Registered Nurse/Mobile Intensive Care Nurse (ARN/MICN) with experience in and knowledge of base hospital telecommunications and **NCEMS** policies and procedures. The PCNC shall function as the prehospital coordinator and liaison to assist the PCMD in the training, continuing education, medical control, and supervision of assigned hospital and prehospital personnel. The PCNC shall perform additional functions as specified by **NCEMS** policy. **HOSPITAL** understands that this position may require at least 25% nurse time.
- F. To provide medical, nursing, and other relevant personnel to participate in classroom teaching, continuing education, skills certification, evaluation, reporting, and patient care review, as needed.
- G. To provide orientation to the LALS/ALS program for emergency department staff.
- H. To have, utilize and maintain two-way radio telecommunications as specified by NCEMS, capable of two-way voice communications with the field units assigned to the hospital. Radio operation must be within FCC standards and follow NCEMS guidelines for system operations. Radio shall be located in the emergency department.
- I. To assure that a physician, licensed in the State of California, is assigned to the emergency department and is available at all times to provide immediate medical direction to the MICN or assigned prehospital personnel, and assures that nurses giving radio direction to EMT-II/P personnel are trained and authorized as MICN by the director of NCEMS. HOSPITAL further agrees that medical direction for LALS or ALS will be provided only by physicians and nurses who are familiar with the policies, procedures, and protocols of NCEMS.

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- J. To evaluate EMT-II/P care upon arrival of the patient in the Emergency Department. All staff shall report problems in prehospital care to the PCMD in a timely manner.
- K. To require all personnel who operate the radio to fill out a radio report on each ambulance call. **HOSPITAL** agrees to make radio reports available to **NCEMS** for patient care review sessions. **HOSPITAL** also agrees to maintain records of communications between the service providers and the **HOSPITAL** through tape recordings and through emergency department communication logs sufficient to allow for medical control and continuing education of the assigned prehospital personnel. The tape recordings and communication logs will be retained by the PCNC for a period of 100 days unless problems are identified in the chart review session that are to be referred to **NCEMS** for resolution, or the recordings are evidence in either a claim filed or pending litigation.
- L. To provide for a continuing education program for assigned prehospital personnel in accordance with policies and procedures of **NCEMS**, including:
  - 1. Organized monthly chart review sessions involving, at a minimum, emergency service personnel who give radio orders, the PCMD, PCNC, and assigned prehospital personnel.
  - 2. Monthly skills maintenance.
- M. To complete, maintain, and make available to **NCEMS** all relevant records for program monitoring and evaluation of the LALS or ALS system. These records include:
  - 1. Prehospital records.
  - 2. Written radio reports.
  - 3. Radio tapes.
  - 4. Emergency Room Record.
- N. To assure that a mechanism exists for replacing medical supplies and equipment used by LALS or ALS personnel during treatment of patients according to policies and procedures established by **NCEMS**. This includes the initial supply and replacement of controlled substances.
- O. To provide indemnification for professional malpractice actions involving staff personnel licensed in the healing arts when acting in the course and scope of their full-time or part-time duties. Any registered student, trainee, or participant in a recognized hospital program, when acting in the course and scope of said program, is included in the HOSPITAL's general liability insurance coverage. NCEMS shall hold harmless the HOSPITAL, its officers, agents and employees from any claim for damages resulting from the acts or omission of NCEMS, its officers, agents, and employees with respect to this program. Likewise, the HOSPITAL shall hold harmless NCEMS, its officers, agents, and employees from any claim for damages resulting from the acts or omission of the HOSPITAL its officers, agents, or employees with respect to this program.
- P. That any advanced prehospital care orders given to field personnel be signed off by the PCMD or Emergency Room Physician.

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- Q. To supervise medical control and quality assurance of hospital personnel involved with medical direction, and of assigned prehospital personnel, in accordance with state law and **NCEMS** policy and procedure.
- R. That patient destination decisions shall not be used for its own commercial advantage, and shall assure that the on-line physician or MICN will issue transportation instructions and hospital assignments upon consideration of **NCEMS** policy, analysis of patient's needs, facility capability and proximity. When **HOSPITAL** directs a patient to another hospital, information regarding the patient will be relayed to the receiving hospital in an accurate and timely manner.
- S. That Base Hospital designation will not be used for marketing, nor for advertising purposes of any kind.

- A. To provide **HOSPITAL** with sample forms for prehospital personnel monitoring.
- B. To provide **HOSPITAL** with data pertaining to prehospital personnel performance.
- C. To participate in a consultant capacity to assist **HOSPITAL** in carrying out the terms, conditions, and intent of this agreement.

#### IV. Designation by **NCEMS**:

Execution of this agreement by all the parties designates HOSPITAL as an approved Base Hospital by NCEMS.
